CSS's regular-season coverage of the Atlantic Sun wraps up with a Peach State battle between Kennesaw State and Mercer. The Bears opened conference play with a 77-75 overtime win at Kennesaw State on January 3. The Owls' Tanner Jacobs grabbed 18 rebounds in this game, 14 of which were offensive boards. His teammate, Shuan Stegall pulled down 17 rebounds of his own. These two come into the finale heading in different directions. The Owls have won three of their last four while the Bears have lost three straight and seven of nine. The Bears feature the top scoring tandem in the league in sophomore James Florence and senior Shaddean Aaron. Florence averages 19.3 points per game, second in the league, while Aaron averages 16.4 points per game. Their combined average ranks over 2.0 points per game better than the next highest-scoring set of teammates (Campbell's Jonathan Rodriguez and Reggie Bishop). Since Kennesaw State joined the A-Sun, two of the meetings with Mercer has gone to overtime, including this year's prior meeting. Four of the five contests have been decided by single digits. The game can also be seen on ASUN.TV.

A-Sun Player of the Week
 Thomas Sanders, Gardner-Webb

Three weeks ago, Gardner-Webb sat muddled in the middle of the Atlantic Sun standings, but a five-game win streak has boosted the Runnin' Bulldogs into a three-way tie for third. Senior Thomas Sanders helped carry Gardner-Webb into that tie with home wins vs ETSU and USC Upstate with two monster performances, highlighted by a 19-point, 22-rebound game vs the Spartans.

Sanders averaged 22.5 points, 5.0 assists and a national-best 19.0 rebounds per game while shooting a sizzling 54.8 percent as Gardner-Webb topped its two opponents by an average of 26.5 points. Sanders had 26 points and 16 rebounds in a decisive 96-70 win over ETSU on Thursday. Sanders scored 19 points on 8-of-12 shooting, and attacked the backboards to the tune of a career-high 22 rebounds as the Bulldogs dominated USC Upstate.

CHASE FOR THE TITLE DOWN TO TWO

Entering the final week of conference play, two teams remain alive in winning the regular-season title. Belmont leads with a mark of 12-2, one game ahead of Jacksonville. The Bruins would clinch the top seed in the General Shale Brick Atlantic Sun Championships with one win or one Jacksonville loss due to owning the head-to-head tiebreaker. Belmont has never won an outright regular-season title; Jacksonville has never won an outright nor shared an A-Sun regular-season title. Of note, the number one seed has not won the A-Sun tournament since Georgia State in 2001 and have lost in the final in five of the last six tournaments.

HARE RISING UP THE CHARTS

With 14 points vs rival Lipscomb, Belmont's Justin Hare passed E.J. Gordon for 10th on the Atlantic Sun's all-time scoring list. Hare has scored 1,693 points in his illustrious career, two more than Gordon. Up next for Hare, UALR'S James Scott, who scored 1,731 points from 1987-1991.

UNF CROSS ANOTHER OFF ITS "BUCKET LIST"

One week after ending its 20-game losing streak, UNF won its first conference game of the season, winning in its final home game, defeating Mercer 70-61. Stan Januska led all scorers in the game with 18 points and James Grimbball recorded his 14th career double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds. The win allowed the Ospreys to avoid becoming the first winless team in A-Sun play since Campbell went 0-20 in 2004-05.

ETSU IMPROVES TO 3-0 IN BRACKETBUSTERS

After two years away from the series, ETSU won its third O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters game, defeating in-state foe Tennessee Tech 88-80 at the Memorial Center. Kevin Tiggs and Travis Strong each scored 20 points in the win. ETSU defeated Fresno State in 2004 by the score of 66-62 in 2004 and Austin Peay in 2005, 85-81 in its prior BracketBusters games.

PAYNE REACHES CENTURY MARK

In his sixth year in Spartanburg, S.C., USC Uptate head coach Eddie Payne won his 100th game at the school. He earned the win by leading the Spartans to a 21-point win at Campbell. Payne's son, Luke led the way in that game with 22 points on 8-for-12 shooting, 4-for-8 from the 3-point arc.

Championship Participants

The A-Sun Championship will be a four-day, single-elimination tournament. Kennesaw State and North Florida are ineligible for the men's basketball championship until 2009-10. Florida Gulf Coast and USC Uptate are ineligible until 2011-12 due to NCAA reclassifying rules. The remaining eight teams will be seeded according to conference winning percentage.

Tiebreaker Format

The following formula shall be used, in order, until the tie is broken:

a. Compare tied teams' (two or more) won-loss percentage versus all teams involved in the tie.

b. Compare tied teams' won-loss percentage versus the top ranked team not involved in the tie, descending to the next highest placed team until an advantage is gained.

c. Coin flip. (winner of the coin flip shall be declared the higher seed)

Tournament History

For the first time in conference history, the men's and women's championships will be contested at the same venue. Lipscomb hosts the 2008 Atlantic Sun Championship. Only two current members own tournament titles: Belmont (2006 & 2007) and Mercer (1981 & 1985). Belmont is one of ten schools in the country to have won its conference's tournament in each of the last two seasons.

* Campbell plays its final men's basketball game at 55-year old Carter Gym on Monday against ETSU. With the opening of the John W. Pope Jr. Convocation Center and Gilbert Craig Gore Arena scheduled for next fall, the Fighting Camels will end nearly a six-decade run in "cozy" Carter.

* In addition, Monday's contest marks the final home playing appearance for two Fighting Camel seniors -- Jake Wohlfel and Reggie Bishop, who rank fifth and seventh, respectively, among the school's career 3-point field goals made leaders and have played key roles in the program's resurgence. For the first time since 1996-98, Campbell has posted double-figure wins totals in 3-straight years.

* Jonathan Rodriguez leads the A-Sun and ranks 19th nationally in scoring (21.2). He has scored in double figures in 34-straight games and has already set school records for free throws made (176) and attempted (231) in a season.

Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs 15-13, 9-5 A-Sun

* Gardner-Webb's Grayson Flittner was "en fuego" in two games for GWU last week, averaging a league-best 26.5 points and shooting a sizzling 15-of-20 from three-point range in two games. He narrowly missed a single-game record for GWU by hitting 9-of-12 from deep in the win over ETSU. Followed that by going 6-for-8 from deep vs. USC Upstate. Flittner has made 94 treys - 13 shy of the A-Sun single-season record (Eric Smith, Campbell).

* Gardner-Webb is averaging a win margin of 19.2 points per game during its current five-game league win streak. GWU has led by at least 27 points in four of those five wins at some point during the second half.

* Thomas Sanders' 18 double-doubles are more than any other player in a single A-Sun season since 1996-1997. Belmont's Adam Sonn is next with 17 (2002-2003). Only Michael Beasley (Kansas State) and Jon Brockman (Washington) have more than Sanders.

* The Dolphins clinched their second straight winning season. It is the first time since the 2000-01 campaign that JU has recorded back-to-back winning seasons and it is just the fourth time that has occurred in the past 20 years.

* For the second straight year JU has pulled out of a slow start to record a winning record. Last year, JU opened 4-8 but finished 15-14. This year's squad started 3-8, recording an eight-game losing streak, before bouncing back. It marks the first time in school history that JU has recorded a losing streak of at least eight and finished with a winning record.

* Marcus Allen has seven 20-point efforts in the last nine games. He needs 76 points to become the 24th member of JU's 1,000 point club.

* Ben Smith's 24 point effort against Kennesaw State was his fourth 20-point night of the season and gives him double figures in scoring for the 23rd time in JU's 26 games.
