***Note Sheet: No. 1 Belmont 87, No. 6 UNF 46***

**BELMONT**

- \* Belmont sets the Atlantic Sun's single-season record for wins with 30. College of Charleston went 29-3 in 1996-97 and Georgia State went 29-5 in 2000-01.
- \* Belmont is the first team in the nation to reach 30 wins.
- \* Belmont is the 14<sup>th</sup> program from outside the BCS to record 30 wins in a season since the start of the 1996-97 season.
- \* Belmont shot 9-for-20 from the 3-point arc. They have won their last 28 games in which they shoot at least 40 percent from the 3-point arc (last loss 79-77 vs No. 16 Tennessee on Dec. 20, 2008).
- \* The 41-point win is the largest in a conference final in the last four years. The only other title game decided by at least 30 came in the 2008 Missouri Valley Conference. Drake beat Illinois State 79-49
- \* Tournament MVP Mick Hedgepeth matched his career high with 23 points. He scored 23 against Eastern Illinois on Nov. 28, 2009. The nine made field goals and 17 attempts both set personal highs.
- \* The Bruins grabbed 23 offensive rebounds tying an A-Sun title game record. Twice a team grabbed 23, most recently accomplished by FAU against Georgia State in the 2002 final.
- \* In three games against UNF, Belmont forced 61 turnovers. Tonight, they converted 22 turnovers into 36 points.

**UNF**

- \* UNF falls to 1-11 in 12 all-time meetings with Belmont.
- \* Prior to tonight's 41-point loss, UNF's last 6 losses were by a combined 41 points.
- \* The 46 points are a season low. The previous low was 48 at Texas on Dec. 14.

**A-SUN CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES**

- \* Belmont wins its fourth A-Sun title, tying the league record. UCF won four, in 1994, 1996, 2004 and 2005.
- \* The 41-point margin of victory breaks the A-Sun Championship record. The previous mark was 28, set twice (1989 UALR defeated Centenary 100-72; 1999 Samford beat UCF 89-61).
- \* Belmont improves to 6-0 as the A-Sun's No. 1 seed. Since 2002, Belmont is the only school to win as the top seed (winning also in 2008).
