**ETSU**

\* The ETSU starters: Mike Smith (24 points), Justin Tubbs (2 points), Micah Williams (9 points), Isiah Brown (7 points) and Adam Sollazzo (4 points) scored all but 8 of ETSU's points; ETSU bench averaged an A-Sun low 10.4 points per game entering today-

\* Smith, the Atlantic Sun Player of the Year scored 24 points, his second-most ever in eight career contests against Campbell. In the seven contests prior to Wednesday night, he averaged 14.3 points per game.

\* ETSU improves to 15-2 all-time against Campbell. The Bucs have won the last four contests and eliminated the Camels in each of the last two A-Sun Championships

\* The Buccaneers totaled only 54 points, their fewest output in a conference tournament game as a member of the Atlantic Sun. The 54 points represent the lowest for the Bucs in a conference tournament game since scoring 56 against College of Charleston in a Southern Conference quarterfinal contest

**CAMPBELL**

\* With six assists, Junard Hartley reached 600 for his career, becoming just the second player in league history to reach that milestone. Centenary's Napoleon Byrdsong holds the A-Sun record with 613. He is only the sixth active player with 600 assists.

\* The Camels have lost their last five A-Sun Championship games. Their last A-Sun win came in the 2007 quarterfinals against Jacksonville.

**A-SUN CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES**

\* The Buccaneers advance to the semifinals for the fifth consecutive year, the longest active streak in the A-Sun.

\* No defending champion has lost its first game the following year since UCF, the champion in 1994, lost in the quarterfinals in 1995

\* In eight instances out of the 11 previous years Campbell qualified for the A-Sun Championship, the team that eliminated the Camels went on to win the A-Sun title. Belmont in 2006, 2007 and 2008 beat Campbell during its runs to the title. ETSU eliminated Campbell in the quarterfinal round a year ago.

\* No. 2 seeds have defeated No. 7 seeds eight straight years. The last No. 7 seed to beat a No. 2 seed came in 2003 when Georgia State defeated Belmont.

\* Tonight was the first one-point game in the A-Sun men's championship since Belmont defeated Mercer 65-64 on March 4, 2009 on a Mick Hedgepeth game-winning lay-up
