

**2011 General Shale Brick
Atlantic Sun Women's Basketball Championship

WINNING TEAM

- * ETSU wins its 10th straight General Shale Brick Atlantic Sun Championship game – the longest streak since Georgia State won 10 in a row 2001 through 2004. FIU won 11 straight while four straight titles from 1992 through 1995, the won a 1996 quarterfinal contest before losing to FAU in the semifinals
- * ETSU improves to 14-1 all-time against Lipscomb, including 11 straight.
- * With 23 points, First-Team All-Atlantic Sun guard Tara Davis increased her career total to 1,146 and passed Sharon Allen (1,142 points) for 13th on the school's all-time scoring list.
- * With four assists, Davis increased her career total to 446 and passed Brooke Wilhoit (445 assists) for second on the school's all-time scoring list.
- * Gwen Washington's 24 points established a career high. She set the prior mark of 19 points against Belmont on Feb. 21, 2011.

LOSING TEAM

- * All-Atlantic Sun Jenna Bartsokas capped her Lipscomb career with 18 points, including five 3-point field goals. The five 3-point field goals matched a season high. She hit five against Stetson on Jan 3.
- * Lipscomb, who entered play ranked 25th in the NCAA and second in the A-Sun connected on 10 today, their sixth game this season hitting at least 10 3's in a game.

A-SUN CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

- * ETSU's win extends the win streak for women's top seeds to 12 in row. The last time a women's top seed lost in tournament play came in 2006 when Belmont lost to Gardner-Webb in the semifinals. No. 1 seeds won 11 straight A-Sun Championship games from 1992 through 1996 and 1997 through 2000.
- * Top seeds improve to 15-1 all-time against the No. 8 seed. No. 1 seeds have won seven straight since Stetson defeated Belmont, 64-61, in 2004.
